

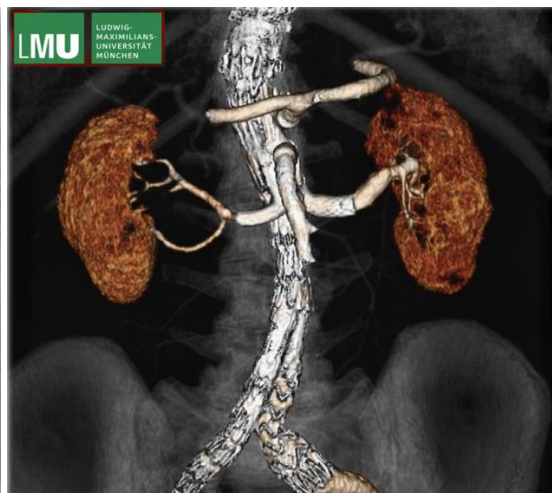

### Aortic Research Fellowship 2023

Vascular and Endovascular Surgery

The **LMU Munich Aortic Research Fellowship 2023** is a research fellowship with a specific focus on the diagnosis and management of complex aortic pathologies. The LMU Klinikum is Germany's second largest hospital, with over 1900 beds. It has two fully equipped hybrid operating theatres and a caseload of over 20 arterial surgical interventions per week (approximately 60 fenestrated/branched EVAR cases per year, 20 fenestrated/branched TEVAR cases per year). The LMU Klinikum's Department of Vascular Surgery offers a wide range of procedures, including carotid, peripheral and haemodialysis access surgery, with open and endovascular aortic interventions being at its core. Aortic procedures performed on a regular basis include fenestrated and branched endovascular repair of arch, thoraco-abdominal and complex abdominal aortic aneurysms, endovascular treatment of aortic dissections, iliac branch devices, treatment of aortic infections and visceral vessel surgery. Innovation and research are an essential part of academic professional development. The Department of Vascular Surgery at LMU Klinikum has currently over 30 ongoing research projects, including basic science research, bench testing and other experimental projects.



## Objectives of the Fellowship:

The fellowship is aimed for advanced vascular surgery trainees or young vascular surgery specialists who have a special interest in management of complex aortic disease and academic development. From a clinical perspective, the fellow will be able to participate in case planning and discussion and will be able to attend the operating theatre on a regular basis, to get acquaintance and gain experience in complex endovascular and open aortic procedures. Furthermore, during the six months of fellowship, the fellow will be involved in the development of at least two/three research projects, which will then be submitted for publication in specified vascular journals.

## Fellowship Period(s):

1 January – 30 June 2023 or 1 July – 31 December 2023

**Also a year`s fellowship will be considered**

- *One letter of recommendation*
- *Full Curriculum Vitae*
